

CRIME VICTIMS' RIGHTS

Your Rights & Responsibilities

Under the Oregon Constitution and Oregon Revised Statutes, if you are the victim of crime, you have rights. Those rights apply to both the juvenile and adult justice systems unless otherwise noted. Sometimes you may need to *request* a right. For example, choosing to be involved in the Post-Conviction process. There may be general services available even after the legal request timeframe expires.

During the Post-Conviction process, the Department of Justice may provide information on legal filings, notice of hearings, and advocacy services when available. This includes actions in state and federal court throughout the appeal, post-conviction, and federal habeas processes. Services are also available as part of the Psychiatric Security Review Board process.

While the Department of Justice cannot act as your attorney, we will work with you during the phases of the process. You are welcome to ask questions, raise issues, or make requests, with or without assistance from an attorney. However, you are always able to have your own attorney if you have specific legal concerns about your case.

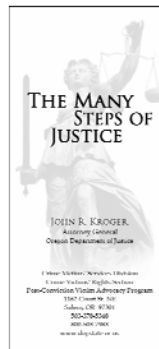
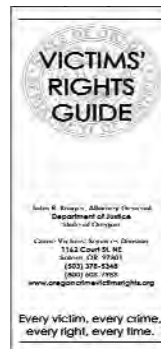
The Grievance Process



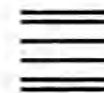
